- 1. Meeting called to order according to Chapter 19.84 and 19.85 (1) (c) of the Wisconsin State Statutes by President Spilde at 7:00p.m.

C. Public Works Department Update

Public Works Update May 19,2025

Water

- Isaac with SEH was here last month and we did testing on wells 1&3 to see how it affected future well 6.
- Great Plains Structures were here as well and performed a ROV inspection on Tower 1. They also replaced the insect mess screen on the vent of Tower 2.
- Haas has completed installing the water main and services on 117th Street.
- Hawkins Chemical has installed 1 65-gallon chlorine tank at well 5. The other 2 tanks are on order and will be installed at wells 2 & 4 when Hawkins Chemical receives them. They are anticipating about 1 week.

Roads

- Senn Blacktop is planning on putting the binder course of blacktop down on Thursday May 22,2025.
- We are renting a mini excavator for the week of May 19-May-23 to do some stormwater repair in our stormwater ponds off Commercial BLVD.
- We will also do culvert work.
- Bud helped Greg Armstrong with the installation of about 20 bike trail posts on signs. That is all Greg Armstrong has material for.
- Scott Decker attended the 2025 Road Builders Conference last month down in Wisconsin Dells at Chula Vista. He received a lot of great training.

Mr. Reilly explained that we did receive seven proposals with competitive rates.

Mr. Hudson reported that this rezone request is for the property at 15855 53rd Ave., Chippewa Falls, WI. The request is to change from a Residential 2 property to a Residential 1 property which allows for single-family dwellings. The property owner is seeking to divide the existing lot into two lots.

2. Discuss/Approve 5.1.06 Chickens within the Residential Zoning District Proposed Revisions Mr. Hudson reported the two changes noted in red on the proposed revisions. These revisions are for the minimum setbacks for a well which for five or less chickens, the setback shall be 8' and with six or more chickens, the setback shall be 50' per Wis. Admin.Code NR 812, Table. A. The other revision is for keeping or maintaining chickens on property zoned Residential 1, which should keep or maintain not more the ten chickens. This was previously set as five chickens.
