Police Department

The Lake Hallie Police Department provides Law Enforcement Protection for the Village and emergency response into the Town of Hallie, 24-hours a day, seven days a week. The estimated 2021 population for the Village was at 7,307 with 321 businesses. The Police Department manages this task with 11 full time Officers (including one full time Detective), 2 part time officers, 2 reserve officers and 2 administrative support staff. The Department also manages all Animal Control functions and contracts with the Eau Claire Humane Association.

No garbage, no appliances/electronics are allowed. No household goods, including furniture, of any kind allowed. Violators will be banned from the site. **This site is video monitored.**

Dog License

All dogs older than 6 months of age must be registered within the Village of Lake Hallie. This license is an annual license that is good for the calendar vear.

Spayed/Neutered = \$10.00 Not spayed/Not neutered = \$20.00

A \$20.00 late fee per dog will be added if licensed after March 31st

The maximum number of dogs per residence is 3 with no more than 5 pet's total.

Noxious Weed Ordinance

On July 2, 2018, the Village Board amended Section 8.9.04 Public Nuisances. The amendment reads as follows:

The Village Board finds that lawns, grasses and noxious weeds on lots or parcels of land which exceed eight (8) inches in length adversely affect the public health and safety of individuals as that they tend to pollinate, constitute fire and/or become a safety hazard. Therefore, any lawns, grasses or weeds located within developed areas of the Village is hereby declared to be a public nuisance and shall be the duty of every property owner to mow or cause to be mowed all grasses or weeds exceeding eight (8) inches in height, except for property located in a designated floodplain or wetland area. In addition, where the owner, occupant, or person in charge of the property fail to cut the law, grass, or weeds set forth above, the village may elect to cut said lawn, grass or weeds and shall charge the expense of doing so at the rate charged for service. If not paid, the charges shall be applied on the tax roll as a special tax against said parcel of land, and the same shall be collected in all respects like other taxes upon real estate, or as provided under Sec 66.615 (3) (f) Wisconsin Statutes.

Important Winter Weather Information

The Police Department would like to remind residents that <u>Winter Parking Restrictions</u> are in effect from **November 15 to March 31** of each year between the **hours of 2:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m.** Exceptions to this winter parking restriction may be requested by contacting the Police Department prior to engaging in the prohibited parking. If a weather emergency is declared because of snow, freezing rain, sleet, ice, snow drifts, other weather events, or its after-effects, all parking is prohibited on the roadway and right-of-way.

- Make sure all mailboxes are in good shape and secured properly. The Village is NOT responsible if the snow from the plow knocks it down.
- Just a friendly reminder to stay at least 200 feet behind the plow trucks.
- Keep all road right of ways clear to allow for snow removal.
- Pushing snow across the roadway from private drives or parking lots is prohibited.
- In the Village of Lake Hallie there are 80 miles of roadway to be plowed.
 We ask for patience with our road crew in cleaning the streets.

Water Conservation Reminder

- Water conservation shall pertain to services connected to the Municipal Water System.
- Residents whose address ends in an even digit may irrigate on even number days and residents whose address ends in an odd digit may irrigate on odd number days.
- Outdoor irrigation season is from May 1st to September 30th.
- Hours of outdoor irrigation are between 5a.m. 8a.m. and 6p.m. 10p.m.
- Irrigation on July 31st and August 31st is prohibited.
